Why Does Planned
Parenthood Need our
Tax Money?

To date, Planned Parenthood Action Fund has given \$30 million to the Clinton campaign,

topping the \$24 million given to both of President Obama's presidential campaigns. Planned Parenthood itself made \$127 million in 2015 and according to its latest annual report, it has over \$ONE \$Billion\$ in net assets. Why does Planned Parenthood need our tax money?

In May, Planned Parenthood made the decision to endorse Hillary Clinton for president. It was the first time in the 100-year history of Planned Parenthood that an endorsement was given in a presidential primary. At the campaign rally in Manchester, New Hampshire, where Clinton accepted their endorsement, Cecile Richards said, "Everything Planned Parenthood has believed in and fought for over the past 100 years is on the ballot." Accepting the endorsement, Clinton said she was "honored" by the endorsement and called a bill to defund Planned Parenthood, "a jarring reminder of what's at stake in 2016," adding that as president she would "defend against attacks on reproductive health care and protect access to affordable contraception and safe and legal abortion across the country."

While other abortion rights groups, including NARAL Pro-Choice America PAC, have also endorsed Clinton, only Planned Parenthood's funding is intrinsically linked to the election of a Democrat president.

The Clinton campaign has functioned as a marketing arm for Planned Parenthood, featuring a section on its official website titled, "17 times Hillary Clinton stood for Planned Parenthood." There are many reasons pro-lifers should not even consider voting for Hillary. Number One is the fact Hillary Clinton has said she will push to overturn the Hyde Amendment. Since 1976, the Hyde Amendment has prevented the use of tax dollars to fund abortion through Medicaid except to save the life of the mother or in cases of rape or incest.

Here are just a few of the many reasons to cut the one-half billion in annual Federal dollars to Planned Parenthood, funding that comes directly from the U.S. taxpayers to Planned Parenthood: Planned Parenthood's business model is centered on abortion. Planned Parenthood has been investigated by Congress for trafficking in intact baby parts. Planned Parenthood does not provide mammograms and is not a significant primary care provider. Planned Parenthood fails to uphold safe health standards in their facilities; and, Planned Parenthood has already been caught misusing taxpayer funds.

☒ "Let me be clear -- I am pro-life... I did not always hold this position, but I had a significant personal experience that brought the precious gift of life into perspective for me."

☒ In 2000, in his book "The America We Deserve", Donald Trump wrote that after consulting with doctors about the partial-birth abortion procedure, he concluded that he would support a ban on that method.

☒ In May 2016, Donald Trump released a list of eleven conservative judges whom he would consider for a Supreme Court vacancy, saying, "By the way, these judges are all pro-life."

☒ Trump's VP choice, Mike Pence, had a solid pro-life voting record on abortion during 12 years in the U.S. House, including votes for passage of the Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act. As governor of Indiana, Mike Pence championed many pro-life measures.

☒ Donald Trump's campaign manager is Kellyanne Conway. Conway is a highly respected strategist and Republican pollster. She is pro-life and not a stranger to Kentucky pro-lifers, having addressed the Kentucky Right to Life Association in the past, at one of its yearly events.

PARTY PLATFORM

The Republican Party Platform affirms "that the unborn child has a fundamental right to life," opposes using government funds to perform or promote abortion or to fund abortion providers, and supports legislation to assist babies who survive abortion.

☒ In 2016, Clinton said, "The unborn person doesn't have constitutional rights," later adding she believed this to be true even on the unborn child's due date.

☒ In 2003, Hillary Clinton voted against the Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act (voted to allow partial-birth abortions to continue) every chance she got.

☒ Clinton's VP choice, Tim Kaine, voted against the pro-life position in the U.S. Senate every chance he got. He voted against the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act. Tim Kaine co-sponsored a bill (S.217) that would nullify virtually all state limits on abortion, including late abortions.

☒ Hillary Clinton has said that she would only nominate Supreme Court justices who would uphold the decision that legalized abortion on demand. "I would not appoint someone who didn't think Roe v. Wade is settled law."

☒ Could this be one of the possible nominees to fill a Supreme Court vacancy during the tenure of President Hillary Clinton...?

PARTY PLATFORM

The Democratic Party Platform supports abortion on demand, and calls for repeal of the Hyde Amendment (which restricts the use of federal funds for abortion). The platform also supports government funding of abortion providers, including Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider.



Pro-Life Measures State by State and Passed into Law as of September 2016

- Alabama:** Ban on abortion facilities within 2000 feet of schools; dismemberment abortion ban.
- Arizona:** No tax-payer funding of abortions.
- Florida:** Termination of most funding of Planned Parenthood; regulations for abortion facilities.
- Georgia:** Funding for pregnancy support services and parenting programs (via grant).
- Kansas:** Permanent defunding of Planned Parenthood.
- Kentucky:** Informed consent for abortions (includes face-to-face consultations).
- Louisiana:** Ban on dismemberment abortions; no tax-payer funding of abortions.
- Michigan:** Protection of women from being coerced into having abortions (two laws passed).
- Mississippi:** Defunding of Planned Parenthood; ban on dismemberment abortion.
- Ohio:** Defunding of Planned Parenthood.
- Oklahoma:** Establishment of a high school fetal development education program.
- South Carolina:** Ban on abortion for babies who feel pain (after 19 weeks).
- Utah:** Abortionists required to anesthetize fetuses before aborting them at/after than 20 weeks.
- Wisconsin:** Title X funding redirected from Planned Parenthood to community health centers.

Note: Although these laws were abortion-related no bills relating to assisted suicide have been passed to date in 2016. However, Colorado will be voting on an assisted suicide measure this November. Currently, five states have legalized physician-assisted suicide: California, Oregon, Vermont, Washington, and Montana. Forty-five states and the District of Columbia consider assisted suicide illegal. Euthanasia is prohibited under general homicide laws by the federal government and all 50 states and the DC. Assisted suicide laws are generally handled by the states.

Planned Parenthood

Top Reasons

2016 Pro-Life Legislation

From January through September 2016 state lawmakers across the United States, including Kentucky, introduced many pro-life bills in their legislatures with a significant number passing into law. According to the Guttmacher Institute, former research arm of Planned Parenthood, states passed 46 pro-life laws and lawmakers introduced 445 pro-life bills.

Guttmacher reported 24 states introduced measures to remove taxpayer funds from Planned Parenthood after an undercover video revealed evidence of possible profiteering from the sale of aborted babies' body parts. Ten states now have laws in effect or are awaiting implementation while

Planned Parenthood lawsuits (or other means) have blocked laws in nine states from going into effect.

Bans on dismemberment abortions and abortions after 20 weeks when unborn babies can feel intense pain (mostly based on National Right to Life Committee's Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act) were introduced or passed at the state level also. Other legislation included requirements for informed consent, abortion facility regulations, and waiting periods. Some states also introduced or passed legislation to ban discriminatory abortions based on the unborn baby's disability, sex or race.



While much of the legislation involved restrictions on abortions, a few states did pass laws in favor of abortions. According to the Guttmacher report, 22 new pro-abortion laws were enacted this year.

Americans United for Life released their "Life List" for 2016 (based on 2015 accomplishments) to recognize the passage and defense of pro-life laws across the country. The Top Ten state rankings are: Oklahoma (new #1), Kansas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Mississippi, Nebraska, Indiana, North Dakota, Missouri, and Texas. **Kentucky was ranked #20.**



